2021 DOG LICENSES ARE NOW OVER DUE!

Please get your dog license applications in now to avoid further late fees. An application must be completed for all new dogs along with a copy of the rabies certificate and spay/neuter certificate if applicable. If your dog was licensed last year, you do not need to fill out another application as their information is already on the licensing program. If your dog's rabies vaccination expired since your last licensing, please submit a copy of the new rabies certificate. Licenses are \$15.00 for spayed/neutered \$20.00 for non -spayed/neutered. ** A \$5.00 per month late fee PER DOG will be assessed. The Dog Registrar's office is open Monday – Wednesday 8:30 am to 4:00 pm. <u>CALIFON SCOUTING IS</u> ACTIVE AND GOING STRONG!

Do your kids enjoy camping and boating? Learning new skills? Helping your community? Having fun and making new friends?

All of this and more is available for boys and girls ages 11-17 in the Scouts BSA, a co-ed program (formerly known as Boy Scouts) dedicated to helping young people grow in their leadership, citizenship, and personal fitness in a safe and supportive environment.

Troop 192 in Califon, chartered at the Lower Valley Presbyterian Church, is the only co-ed Scouts BSA program in the Voorhees sending district, with a current roster of 16 scouts – a great size for youth involvement and program agility.

Despite COVID restrictions, the Califon scouts have kept busy this Spring! In the week leading up to Valentine's Day on Feb 14, Troop 192 conducted a local food drive by dropping empty shopping bags at homes around town and returning to pick them up a week later. In the final tally, Troop 192 collected over 900 pounds of food from the generous residents of Califon and delivered these to the Open Cupboard Food Pantry in Clinton, NJ.

On Mar 14, Troop 192 conducted a "Scouting for Litter" event, which involved Scouts canvassing through town with 5-gallon buckets to pick up litter from our streets and yards. We collected over 12 full buckets of litter, leaving Califon a little cleaner than we found it. A special thank you to Califon Lumber for the donation of safety gloves for the Scouts.

Beyond these events, we have a full program of exciting activities planned for the rest of Spring 2021, including camping trips, backpacking, a canoe trip to the Mullica river, a Pinewood Derby, and more community service projects. We strive to "do a good turn daily" – the Scout slogan.

2021 CURBSIDE BRUSH-PICKUP- MONDAY MAY 17TH PLEASE READ THE GUIDELINES BELOW

- The DPW will be conducting the annual curbside brush pick-up this year. For the past few years, this eagerly anticipated annual event has led to an excess of what the Mayor and Council have always advertised as a "reasonable" amount of brush that residents put out curbside. This excess has resulted in an inefficient and lengthy amount of time to complete the project and therefore, extreme budget cost over-runs.
- Mayor and Council wish to remind residents that this is a "brush" pick-up; small brush, twigs, branches; not intended for tree removal or land clearing.
- In an effort to get this annual project back on track as was originally intended, Mayor and Council are implementing strict **guidelines** that they are asking all participating residents to abide by. Thank you for working with us to keep this project economically feasible so that we can continue to offer this service to our residents.

• GUIDELINES FOR BRUSH-PICK-UP

- *Branches must be 4 inches in diameter or smaller
- *The maximum amount of brush that can be placed at the curb is (1) one pile of branches, brush,

not to exceed 4 feet high by 4 feet wide by 10'long

- *No brush/branches in roadway
- *No brush/branches on sidewalks
- *Brush piles should not be beside shrubbery, posts, hydrants, electrical or cable boxes,
- mailboxes, and/or any other objects
- *The brush removal service provided by the Borough is restricted to residential pruning only
- *Brush will not be collected from any commercial businesses
- *Brush mixed with stumps, roots, leaves, grass, dimensional lumber, firewood or oversized material are not acceptable and will be refused
- *Brush must be stacked perpendicular to the curb, in front of your property, not exceeding the length, height, and diameter listed.
- *Brush must not be stacked at the curb any earlier than 1 week prior to collection week (May 10^{th)}. Brush should be placed at the curb by 6:00 am on May 17TH.
- *There will only be one pick up at your residence during the scheduled week.
- *If the guideline for height, width and length of brush pile is exceeded, excess brush will be refused
- *All guidelines will be strictly enforced
- If residents are in need of tree removal or other land clearing, please hire local contractors for the work. For referrals, please call the Municipal offices at (908) 832-7850 ext. 201.
- If any residents would like a load of chips, please call the Municipal offices to make arrangements with the DPW for delivery to your residence.
- Mayor and Council wish to thank all residents in advance for their cooperation this year. If past trends were to continue, affordability and continuation of this program would be in serious jeopardy


