A Piece of Califon's History Restored By Patty Nanna

"Let's Go Down To Califon" is a poem written by James Alexander Elliott describing a trip into town to shop, chat with neighbors and see what was going on in Califon's hub. At the turn of the century, our town was a bustling community of stores and businesses providing essential goods and services to the surrounding area. One of the businesses operating during the late 1800s early 1900's was the Apgar Wagon Repository,



owned by David Apgar and his younger brother, Mancius Apgar, which was located on Frog Hollow Road (now Philhower Avenue). The Apgar brothers were dealers of wagons, carriages, buggies, surries & sleighs; the business also maintained, repaired and painted horse-drawn vehicles. They operated this Repository from about 1895 until 1913 when the building was destroyed by a fire. David built a new repository in late 1914 (now the Upholstery Shop) and operated it until 1917 when the automobile industry was emerging.

As a member of the Califon Historical Society, I am always excited when we acquire a piece of Califon's history. This recently happened when Stan Knapik, a Connecticut resident, contacted the Society to inquire if we would be interested in purchasing a sleigh sold by D.K. Apgar between 1910 and 1914. Mr. Knapik originally purchased the sleigh from eBay in 2008 from its owner in Trenton, N.J. The sleigh, which was described as a "cutter", is a lightweight, fast sleigh with a single seat that can accommodate two people. It has a small, brass nameplate inscribed with "Sold & Warranted By D.K. & M.H. Apgar, Califon, NJ." At the time Mr. Knapik purchased the sleigh, it was a little over 100 years old and was in poor condition. However, after six months of careful restoration, it looks much like it did when it was originally sold by the Apgar Repository.

The Califon Historical Society is proud to "unveil" the sleigh at our Holiday Open House on December 3rd and 10th from 1:00 - 4:00 pm. Both the Hoffman House & Cabin by the River (on River Road) are decorated for the holidays showcasing old-tyme toys of Califon residents, antique trains, holiday memorabilia & vintage holiday decor. There is also a photo display of the sleigh's complete restoration. Santa visits both weekends for photo ops with children, adults and pets. Stop by to see the beautiful restoration done on the sleigh, enjoy some holiday cheer and refreshments!
