# What is Tier A?

As a result of actions taken by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, we have been required to institute new ordinances regulating activities related to stormwater management and to change how we maintain the borough's roads, storm drainage systems, and other infrastructure. We are striving to do so in a way that minimizes costs while, we hope, improving the quality and management of the community's stormwater.

In July 2022, the state DEP informed Califon that our community would be reclassified from a Tier B to a Tier A municipality to permit our stormwater management systems. In order to maintain a Tier A permit, Califon must perform specific actions that were not required by a Tier B permit. These include the creation of a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan, the posting of certain stormwater documents and other information on our webpage, the implementation of community-wide pollution-prevention programs, improved mapping of stormwater infrastructure, training for borough employees and officials, and the implementation of required ordinances for the borough.

Those new ordinances are the most recent changes brought on by the new Tier A requirements mandated by the state. Several codify things that most of you are already doing, such as prohibitions regarding littering and feeding wildlife on public lands, requirements to dispose of pet waste and yard waste properly, private storm inlet requirements, and tree removal and replacement requirements. The last ordinance may be the one likely to impact residents the most. Permits are now required to remove certain trees on private property, and planting replacement trees may be required. There are exclusions and exceptions for certain emergency situations. While this state-mandated ordinance requires more from property owners, it is also our hope that it will improve (and help to reduce) stormwater in Califon. The texts of the new ordinances, adopted in April 2024, can be found in Title 17 of the borough code, which is located on the Stormwater section of our home page and within the Code section under Ordinance 2024-02. Please contact the borough if you need further information.

The borough will also be required to change and upgrade how it constructs and maintains roads and stormwater facilities. For example, the frequency of street sweeping on borough roads will need to increase to three times a year to keep more pollution out of stormwater, our streams, and the river. We will also be required to repair and possibly reconstruct inlets and other municipally-owned stormwater structures to reduce pollution. These standards will also require increased training and documentation. We will work with Tewksbury Township, our public works provider, to meet these state standards as cost-effectively as possible and pursue funding offered by the state DEP and other agencies to cover some of the costs.

The Tier A requirements also include increased public outreach and communication. While this letter is a start, please look for additional information on stormwater in our community on our website and other publications. If you have any questions about how these changes may apply to your property, please reach out for more information.



Califon School opened the 2024-2025 school year with 92 students enrolled this year which is 10 more students than last September. Staff returned on August 26 & 27 for Professional Development and room preparation. Students started on August 28 with our opening day tradition when students, parents and staff gathered in the courtyard to cheer on the new school year at the sound of our school bell.

Califon School enjoyed recognition from the GoHunterdon Safe Routes to School Program where the district received the gold status for our commitment to the program. Although we are a walking district, there is a definite increase in students walking to school with their parents.
